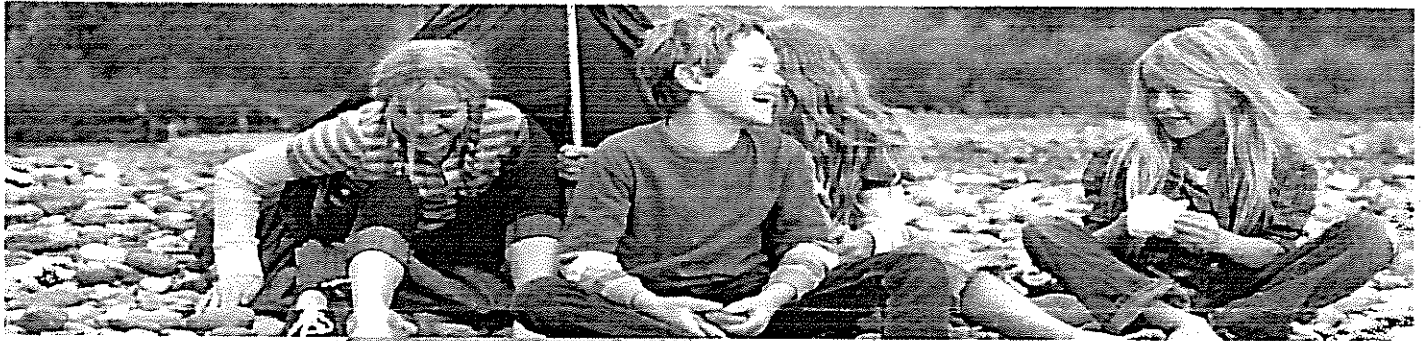

ORIGINS: On January 13, 1984, President Ronald Reagan issued a proclamation designating January 22, as the first National Sanctity of Human Life Day. (January 22, 1973, was the day the U.S. Supreme Court legalized abortion-on-demand in all 50 states.) Churches around the United States use this day to celebrate God's gift of life, commemorate the many lives lost to abortion and to commit themselves to protecting human life at every stage.

UPCOMING DATE: Churches continue to recognize the third Sunday in January as "Sanctity of Human Life Sunday". Here at Trinity, we will be observing the "Sanctity of Human Life" on Sunday, January 15th.

Please note that girl's clothing and blankets are NOT needed at this time.

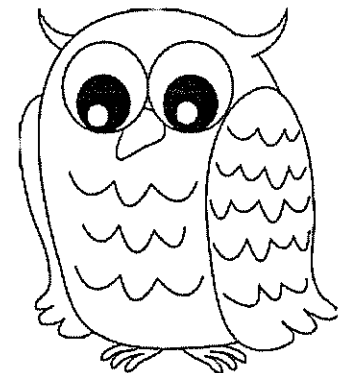

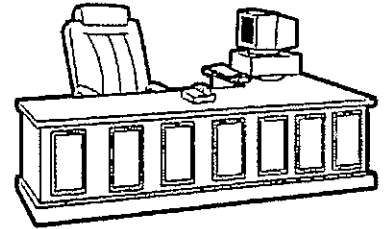

From the Desk of our **President**



Happy New Year! As we begin this new year, I just want to state again how very blessed we have been here at Trinity! I am so thrilled to have a Finance Board! The Board of Elders and Spiritual Ministries with the addition of John Kruger, is full as is the Board of Property Management. The Board of Christian Education has been joined by Candy Reed and still has one more seat available. Thank you to all of you who attended the Voter's Meeting on December 11th. I hope you were all excited to hear the reports from the Boards...there is a lot of good stuff going on here! Boards not only have a five year plan, they are working those plans. We also hope you had a chance to enjoy the lunch and fellowship that comes from "breaking bread" together. It's always a joy to see so many of you sitting and visiting before and after our church services and meetings. Thank you, again for your time.

A **BIG** thank you to Karen Langhorn and Linda Rains for coordinating the soup luncheon and soup suppers for the Advent Services. Again, loved the fellowship!

The Board of Property Management is meeting regularly on the 2nd Saturday of each month at 8 am. All trustees are included in this meeting to discuss plans and upcoming projects, so everyone knows what is going on.

Don't forget the Church Clean Up Day on the second Saturday of each month. In January we will be taking down the Christmas decorations. Mark your calendar so you can join us.

For those of you who were unable to attend the Voter's meeting, here is a quick snapshot of our financial standing as of November 30th, 2016. Based on the budget presented and accepted at the May Voter's meeting, we expected an income of \$313,165 by this point in time, we actually have taken in \$331,839. There is an increase of approximately \$8K in offerings and \$11K in school income. Our expense budget was expected to be \$365,706 and the actual came in at \$325,775. Your giving to the building fund put an additional \$15,889 towards paying down the mortgage. Instead of being in a position of using our emergency funds and having a \$50K deficit, we are in the black with \$6K.

Business that is ongoing for the Executive Council is putting together a Policy Manual for Trinity. Last spring the congregation voted on the marriage policy and this meeting we added our statement of belief. Each policy needs to be approved by the congregation. In today's world, these policies are mandatory for protecting our ministry. We will keep working to accomplish this task.

Please join me in giving praise and thanksgiving to God for His blessings which includes those who have stepped forward to do His work here at Trinity.

Here's a look at what is happening in January:

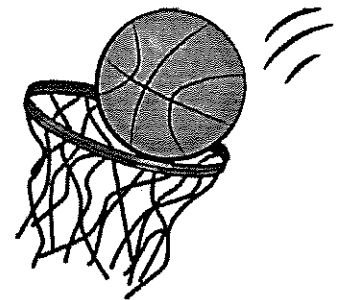

2017 OFFERING ENVELOPES –are here! Numbers have changed, so **please do not use** the 2017 envelopes until Sunday, January 1st or your contributions may not be credited correctly to **YOUR** account.



Did you know: if you do not mark your giving envelope, all monies go into the “General Fund”. If you write an amount in on the line for either Missions or Building Fund, those monies are accumulated and at the end of each calendar month, distributed accordingly.

Did you know: those who mark their envelopes with amounts for Missions allow Trinity to send between \$10K to \$15K per year to the Rocky Mountain District for the missions selected. Some of those missions are posted on the Mission bulletin board in the Narthex.

Did you know: that when you write an amount in the Building Fund space on your giving envelope, that those monies are added to the LCEF mortgage payment each month, to pay down the mortgage loan principal. An average month sees our loan being paid down by more than \$1000.00. Take that times 12 months and we just made an additional monthly payment. In addition, less interest is paid from our loan payment and more goes towards the principal.

To recap:

- *Current Expenses: goes to paying our bills, water, electric , insurance, gas, salaries, etc.
- *Missions: goes directly to Rocky Mountain District for the missions they have selected
- *Building Fund: is added monthly to the mortgage payment as additional principal

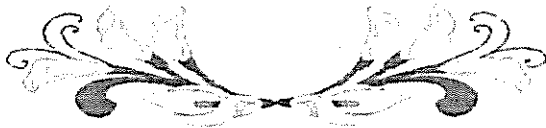

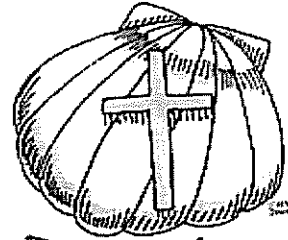
