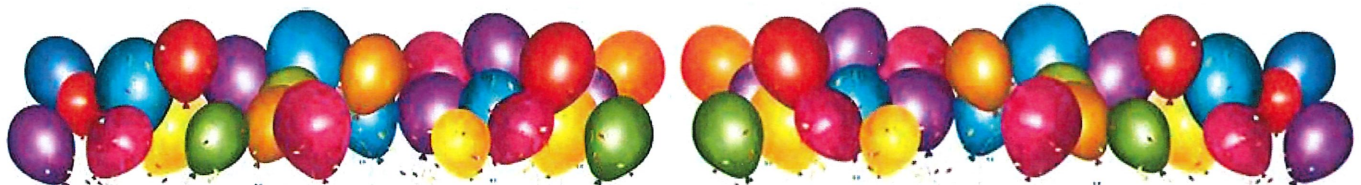

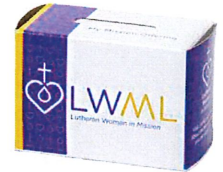

Notice of this meeting was given in advance to all members of the council.

The meeting was called to order at 8:40 am by Vice President Bob Thorgesen. Pastor opened with prayer. Minutes of the August council meeting were distributed via email. The minutes were approved as written.

**Treasurer's Report**—Vicki Akin presented the current financial report for discussion and acceptance.

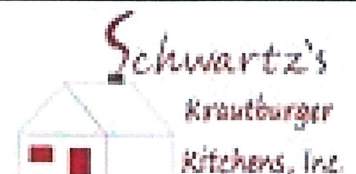

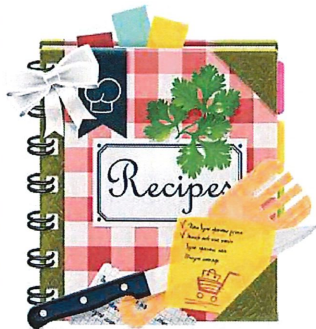
**Calling all cookers and eaters of food!**

Happy Fall Y'all,

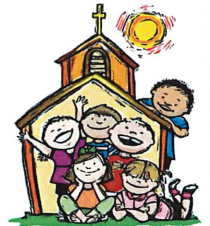

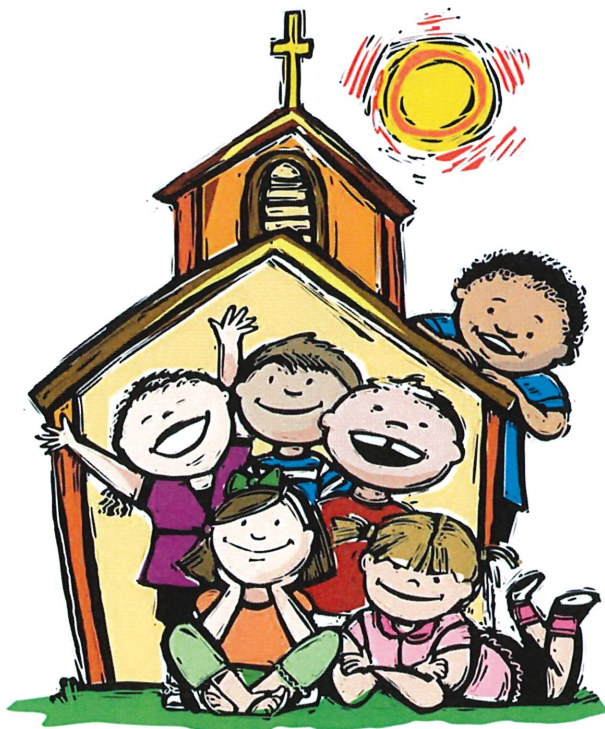


# Help us with our Scholarship Fundraising Campaign!

Here we are at the beginning of a new school year and our Scholarship Fundraising Campaign. God continues to bless Trinity and its mission, Trinity Lutheran School. With His guidance, we were able to keep our students in the classroom with face-to-face instruction throughout the year, last year. That among other things has led to an increase in families who want their children here at Trinity. Most of our classrooms are running at near capacity numbers and yet the amount of tuition assistance that is needed has gone down. This year the goal is to raise \$40,000.00 for the Scholarship Fund, which is \$5,000 less than last year.

Your generous gifts have helped families get back on their feet after the pandemic crisis threatened the Christ-centered education they desired for their children as well as the continuity they needed. How does a parent look for employment when their children are at home remote learning? Without a job, how does the parent provide shelter, food, and tuition? Thankfully, you helped provide funds to assist these families with their tuition so they could concentrate on the shelter and food.

This year we have 54 students enrolled in K-8 and 20 of those students need assistance. Some need as little as \$72 a month, while some need the full \$360 per month. Every family that receives assistance is asked to do community service hours in exchange for their assistance. They do this by giving of their time to help with Porkchop-on-a-stick events, Picker's Paradise, field trip chaperones, and things around the campus like touching up paint, gluing down molding and stair covers.



Our mission is to share the good news of God's love for all mankind. That love is so great that God sent His One and Only Son into this world to suffer our sins and die on the cross to pay for those sins. With His resurrection our salvation is assured. That good news is shared daily here at Trinity and through those teachings God called upon school families to bring their children to be baptized resulting in an unprecedented 12 baptisms last year that were school related. God has blessed us so that we may share our blessings and others may be blessed through the gifts that we give. Please prayerfully consider your blessings and giving to the Scholarship Fund.
